What do I need to do for each challenge?

1. Re-write the blurb for a book you have read. It must make people want to read the book but don't give too much away!
2. See the Reading Bug display in the library to find out which books are included in this scheme. Collect a quiz from the Librarian and hand it in when you have finished.
3. Create a colourful poster which could be used in the library to advertise your chosen book.
4. Research your chosen author and tell me about their life. You can use the template from the library.
5. Design a bookmark with an image on one side and a book review on the other.
6. Using the template from the library, write down ten facts which you find in a non-fiction book
7. Use your best letter writing skills to tell your favourite author what you thought of their book. These letters will be sent to the authors so make sure you write a good one!
8. Design a cover which would tempt people to pick this book up off the shelf.
9. Use drawings, text or printed images to create a scrapbook based on your book. Use your imagination and be creative.
10. Look up your 5 words in a dictionary and then show you understand their meaning by putting them in a sentence.

10. Pick five words which were new to you in this book. Find out their meaning. Write a sentence for each word.
