To stop people from sharing their germs and getting sick my school was closed to most students.

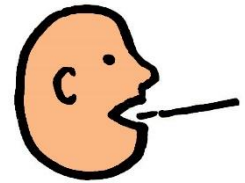
I had to stay at home and stay safe.

The school building

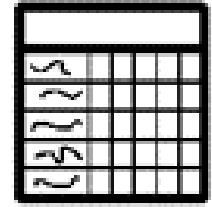


The adults who work at school.

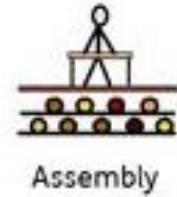
The children



My timetable is going to be the same as it was before the Christmas holidays. This includes the times of the day, break time and lunch time, as well as home time.

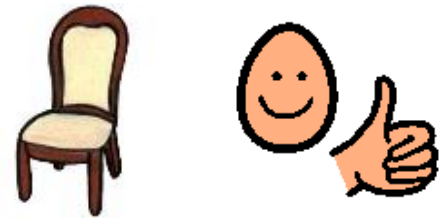


Assemblies will be as they were before Christmas and we will watch some assemblies on the screen on my form room.

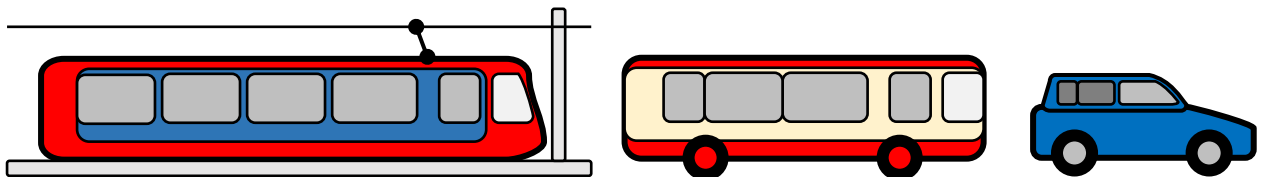


Things that might be different:

The way I travel to school may change as public transport may not be running as it used to. **This is ok** as it is happening to keep us safe.

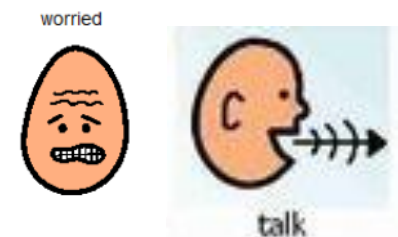


Sometimes change makes us feel worried or sad, **that's ok.**

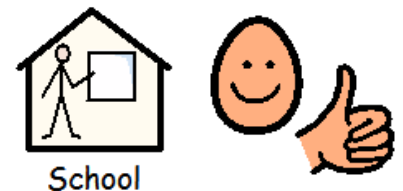
Everyone feels worried sometimes.
