Our Pupil Premium allocation this year is: £173,365

The aim of the Pupil Premium Plan is to allocate resources in the most effective way to ensure that disadvantaged pupils make good progress in line with other pupils in school.

The focus will be to build on successful strategies from previous academic years. Our aim is to ensure that disadvantaged pupils can access an appropriate curriculum and that they are supported to overcome any barriers to learning.
