Suggested websites for revision	Using your notes: Make sure you know your poems! This will make all the difference.
	 How to revise: Re-read the poems. Learn the story of the poem – bullet point, in order, what is happening/what is being described in the poem. List the key message/s the poet wants to convey (get across). Select 5-7 key quotes from across the poem that you think best conveys the key messages/themes in the poem. For each quote mini mind-map how you would analyse it. Note down connotations and impact of particular words and poetic devices. Context – learn 3 pieces of context. Make sure at least 2 of the quotes you've selected can be linked to context. Test your knowledge Try to tell somebody in your house all about a poem without using your anthology. You could give someone in your house your anthology and
	ask them to test you. Or use the look/cover/write method. Please note: you do not need to memorise quotations as the poem will be printed in the exam (you will for your GCSE though). Extra revision: 1. Use GCSE Pod to support your understanding of each poem. 2. Practise: use your teacher's guidance to practise responding to a poem in 30 minutes. Use the question style: how does *writer* present *theme* in *poem*? 3. Use your friends/classmates: why not digitally come together to write an essay? Or ask them for feedback?
Additional hints/tips	Try your best to prepare for this assessment. The best thing you can do it keep up with the work set on Show My Homework, and make sure you submit any essays your teacher sets you, so you can get feedback. Everything set between now and the summer will help you to prepare for this exam. Please do contact your teachers if you have any questions or would like any more support.
