At St Hilda's College, we pride ourselves on enjoying success with all of our students. We recognise that one-to-one support is needed for all of our students such as students with additional needs and support programmes for our high achievers.

Our High Achievers benefit from the HE+ programme which complements our in-house support. The programme is run by Cambridge University and allows those students who are seeking to apply to Cambridge or Oxford, Russell Group universities or universities in other countries to develop key skills that will assist them with their applications. The programme includes interactive web based forums, contact with Cambridge academics, super-curricular subject sessions and a residential at Cambridge University.

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The programme has given me the chance to consider hid es, which oth lude in my options. In the most recent event, we watched a presentation about life in Cambridge and were able to talk to a lot of the students who attend there. It was very insightful and provided me realistic expectations about student life in University. St Hilda's College is proud to offer the right courses, excellent advice and guidance, alongside a bespoke work experience placement, a varied and exciting enrichment programme and pathways to university or employment. Our experience allows us to make sure that each student is on a programme of study that is aspirational and will help them to secure high quality employment or gain a place at a university of their choice.

With over 20 courses at level 3 to choose from, students have the opportunity to study a highly personalised curriculum, choosing from both academic and vocational courses at level 3/A level. There is also the opportunity to re-take GCSE English and/or mathematics if needed.

By completing an EPQ pupils will gain valuable UCAS points which can be used when applying to university, however I feel the greatest benefit is the organisational, time-management and research skills which the students will develop during the course of the project - skills which universities and employers value very highly.



Many of our students go on to further study at university. We spend a lot of time working with our students on choosing a suitable course and giving themselves the best opportunity in producing a successful application. We guide students through the process of writing a personal statement and making their application through UCAS. We have access to careers advisors for those who are unsure as to what their next step is. Tailor made support is given for all applications. We recognise that the process can be confusing and offer UCAS drop-in sessions for all students.

In addition to supporting our students, we also run information evenings for parents who may be unfamiliar with the process or the changes that have been made over recent years.

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For some students, university may not be their first choice and we fully support this. We offer support for students looking for further study at College and assist those looking for an apprenticeship or full-time employment. We work with our students on producing CVs, letters of application and offer mock interviews to give them the best chance of success. Our careers advisor has access to the latest apprenticeships and vacancies and complement the support we offer.
