APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY

Because the university application process should be the same next year, we've put together:

Simple steps to your application

- register with UCAS here for 2021 entry
- add your course choices you can add up to five course choices, but can only apply to a maximum of four courses in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine/science
- attach your personal statement and references
- pay the application fee
- submit before the deadline of 15 January 2021 (6pm) for the majority of undergraduate courses

(The deadline for Oxford and Cambridge applications and most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine/science has now passed.)




We're here for you

Our campus and Covid-19

Our priority on campus is your safety, so if restrictions are still in force, we'll be following them closely.

That means we can be responsive in the measures we take – easing precautions as soon as it's safe to do so; acting quickly and responsibly if the situation changes.

LEARNING WITH US

At Newcastle our teaching is gold standard; we achieved the best possible outcome – a Gold Award – in the Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF).

That means you'll learn from world-leading experts and top academics at the cutting-edge of your discipline. And, because we're a research-intensive Russell Group university, our pioneering research will also feed in to your degree.

Supporting your studies on campus will be anatomy labs and clinical skills suites, studios for architecture, art, media and music, a smart grid lab and energy storage test bed, a museum, an art gallery and much more. Off campus, we have two commercial farms and a biological field station, as well as a sea-going research vessel, coastal station and marine lab.

You'll also access our facilities at the state-of-the-art Newcastle Helix site, from our £58m Urban Sciences Building that's home to the School of Computing, to the Frederick Douglass Centre with its innovative learning and teaching spaces.

How you'll learn

Studying at university is different to school, but we'll help you grow in confidence with:

- lectures and seminars
- practical sessions
- · small group learning
- self-study
- research
- fieldwork

Currently, because of physical distancing restrictions, learning is through a mixture of online and in-person on-campus teaching. Lecture materials, as well as many tutorials, seminars, workshops and labs, are being delivered online, but students also access in-person labs, seminars and tutorials.

Online learning

If Covid-19 restrictions are in place and elements of your course are delivered online, you'll access study materials through our virtual learning environment, Canvas.

- you'll need a computer, laptop or tablet, and a stable internet connection – but don't worry if you don't have these things; we'll make sure you have the resources you need
- you'll follow a timetable, attending online taught sessions at scheduled times. You'll have coursework to complete, as well as lecture and seminar preparation, plus further reading to do in your own time
- there'll be exams and assessments so don't expect your course to be easier if some elements are online!
- you might need video chat software, such as Zoom or Microsoft Teams – our IT team will help you access the software and technical support you need
- using collaborative tools means you'll engage with your lecturers and fellow students, just as you would in a physical classroom environment

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LIVING WITH US

Each of our residences has its own identity and quirky character, all are in great locations on campus or just minutes away, and are either University-owned sites or managed partnership accommodation owned by a private company, but run in partnership with us.

Our residences have great communal areas and social spaces to create that community vibe; some have gaming areas, study zones, and offer bike storage and car parking, or even an on-site gym.

How to apply for accommodation

You'll be invited to apply for your accommodation once you've received an offer from us.

- 1. Register with us through our application portal
- 2. Log on to the application home page
- 3. Create your application, listing your three favourite residences
- 4. Submit

We'll email you – usually later in the summer – with details of your allocated accommodation and how to accept the offer

And don't worry – we allow plenty of time for you to choose your accommodation, and we don't process applications on a first-come, first-served basis.

Your ResLife

Our dedicated ResLife team will support you to settle in with a programme of fun, social events and life skills workshops. If you need advice or just a friendly chat, the team offers one-to-one support and drop-in sessions, too, so there's always someone you can talk to.


We know your education has been hugely disrupted by the pandemic and we're determined you'll have the support you need if you join us.

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




OUR LIBRARIES

You'll have access to extensive print and e-resources for all subjects, e-versions of key reading list materials, innovative learning spaces, PC clusters and a laptop loan scheme.
